9. Objectives: The main objectives of this fieldwork are to analyse the various socio-economics data available from the study area and application of various cartographic measures to understand the nature of problems.
10. Methodology & Data Collection (2-3 Sentences): Different methods are applied for field study; like- Pre-field Study is related with the data collection and to get information of the study spots, like mouza map, census report, climatic data, topographical map etc. Field study is related to door to door survey to collect different information from the ward people, intensive study of the visited area etc. Post field method is related to the analytical study of collected data from field study and different reports on soils taken from the laboratory which was collected from field.
11. Major findings (4-5 Sentences): A socio-economic survey in this area would likely highlight the significance of tourism on local economic activities. It might detail employment rates in sectors directly related to tourism, such as hotels, restaurants, and travel services, as well as in ancillary services like food production, retail, and construction. The survey could provide insights into housing quality, access to basic

utilities (like clean water, electricity, and sanitation), and the living conditions of different socio-economic groups within the population.

12. Outcome (4-5 Sentences): The socio-economic survey of GREATER VISAKHAPATNAM MUNICIPAL CORPORATION (GVMC), VISAKHAPATNAM, ANDHRA PRADESH, likely reveals the pivotal role of tourism in driving local economic development, creating employment opportunities, and shaping the livelihoods of the community. However, it also underscores challenges such as environmental degradation, seasonal employment volatility, and the need for sustainable practices to balance economic growth with ecological preservation. Educational and healthcare infrastructure, while improving, requires further enhancement to meet the growing needs of the population. The survey highlights the necessity for targeted interventions to address income disparities and ensure that the benefits of tourism and development are equitably distributed among all community members.

13. Conclusions / Suggestion: The Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal Corporation (GVMC) presents a diverse and evolving urban landscape, shaped by its demographic patterns, occupational structures, literacy levels, and cultural composition. The data paints a portrait of a city in transition—marked by commendable achievements in certain wards and pressing challenges in others. Literacy rates across GVMC demonstrate considerable variation, with Ward 54 emerging as a beacon of educational excellence and gender equity, while Wards 55 to 57 reveal notable educational deficits, particularly among women. These disparities underscore the urgent need for gender-responsive and ward-specific educational interventions, as literacy remains foundational to sustainable development and social mobility. In sum, GVMC stands at a pivotal point. By learning from high-performing wards and addressing gaps in education, employment, and demographic equity, the municipality can craft a developmental blueprint that is inclusive, resilient, and future-facing. Strategic, data-driven interventions across literacy enhancement, economic diversification, gender empowerment, and cultural inclusion will be central to realizing GVMC's full potential as a sustainable urban centre.

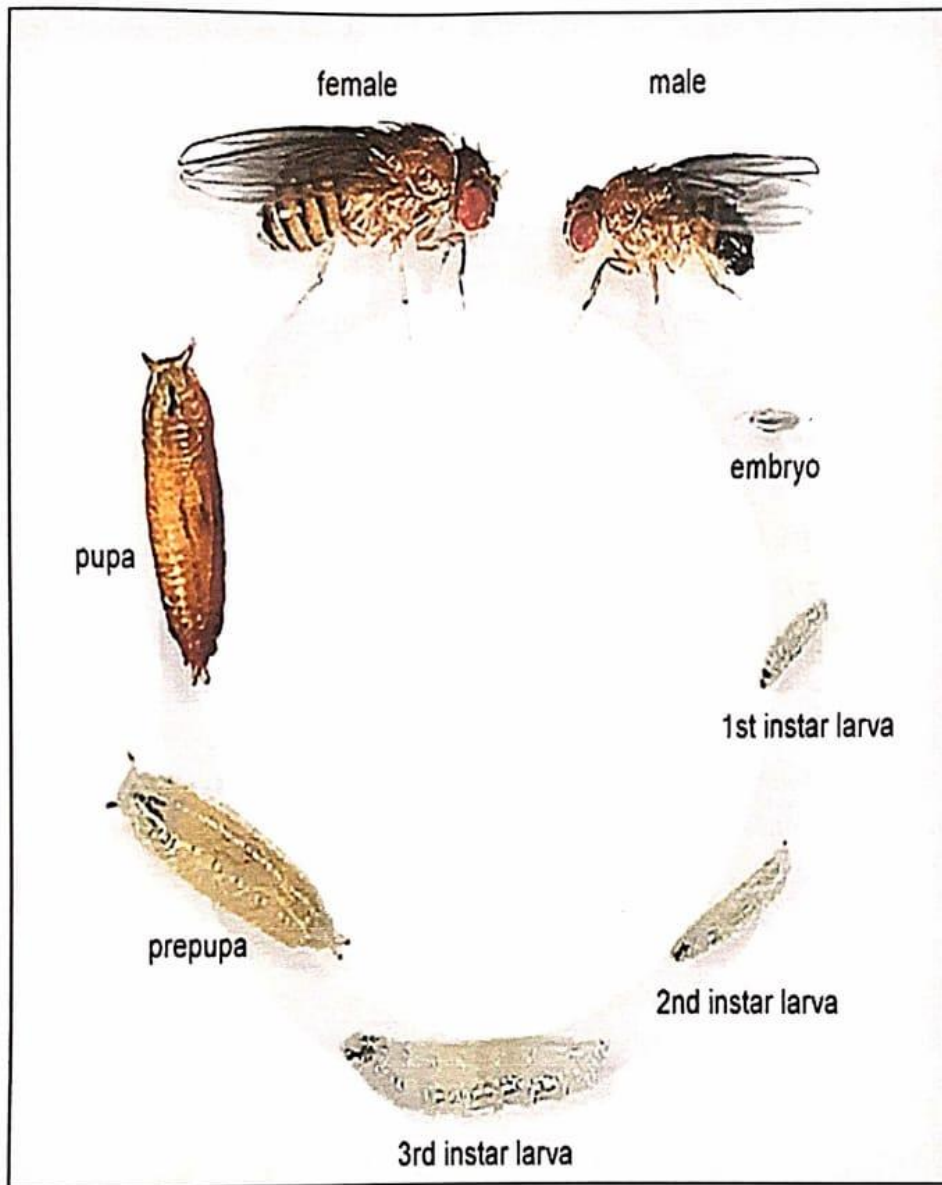


Fig: Life Cycle of *Drosophila* sp.

external wings or legs, known as the "prepupa." A very fine prepupal cuticle has been secreted and surrounds the prepupa.

Pupation takes place about 12 hours after puparium formation. By muscular contraction, the prepupa draws back from the anterior end of the puparium and alters its head structures. This movement also ejects the larval mouth armature, which until now was attached to the anterior end of the prepupa. The wings, halteres, and legs also undergo ejection. A typical pupa possesses a shaped head, thorax, and abdomen. In this section, it is seen that the pupa now lies within three membranes: an outer membrane, the puparium; an intermediate membrane, the prepupalcuticle; and an inner membrane, the newly secreted pupal cuticle.

Metamorphosis now involves the destruction of certain larval tissues and organs (histolysis), as well as the organization of adult structures from primitive cell complexes, the imaginal discs. It must, however, be realized that some larval organs are transformed into their imaginal state without any very drastic change in their structure. The nature and extent of these transformation processes vary greatly for the different organs involved. Larval organs that are completely

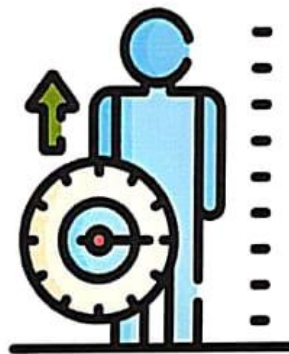
