#### Qualitative analysis of Criterion 1

The Sonamukhi college conducts UG (Honors & General) programmes in various disciplines of Science, Humanities and Commerce. College is affiliated to Bankura University, Bankura. Few faculty members, who are the members of Under Graduate Board of Studies (BOS), have contributed towards development of the curriculum. The curriculum delivery system is effective as per the available resources and infrastructure. The Academic Calendar is follows as per affiliating University. The college follows the CBCS syllabus as framed by the affiliating University. Different Academic Sub-Committee with the Principal, IQAC coordinator and senior teachers of each department formulate the time table at the beginning of each academic session/ semester to ensure effective delivery of curriculum. Teaching plan and Academic Calendar are decided synchronizing with probable Examination schedule of the Bankura University. Syllabus distribution is done among the faculties of each department at their respective departmental meeting. The faculty members distribute the syllabus to the students at the beginning of Semester. The college also provides internet facility, INFLIBNET and ICT classrooms to meet the demands of the students and faculty members. During the recent pandemic situation e-learning resources have been strengthened. The institution has started Diploma in Nursing Assistance and skill-based courses, which needs a great attention. Feedback from the students on curriculum and teachers' evaluation although is in place. The faculty members attended different Orientation Programs, Faculty Induction Programs, Refresher Courses, Academic Conferences, Seminars and workshops to keep them upgraded. The experimental learning is carried through field surveys and excursions in some departments. The college has distance education learning system through NSOU and presently provides one UG and six PG courses.

The students of the college come from varied socio-economic backgrounds. The admission process is merit based and complete transparency is strictly maintained.

Master routine, departmental routine, remedial classes are arranged time to time. There are mentor-mentee groups in each department. Faculty members mentor students in different groups. There is a provision of Internal Assessment before the End Semester Examination. As soon as an academic year begins, the students are supplied the academic calendar, the class time table and planned academic programs through special interactions. On the college website as well as on the college notice boards, the information about Program Outcomes (PO), Program-Specific Outcomes (PSO) and Course Outcomes (CO) are displayed. The slow learners are identified and they are encouraged to take part in remedial classes. Some academic programs like seminars, debates and Power Point Presentations in classrooms are organized to encourage the advanced learners for active participation. The students also participate in different departmental seminars.

The teachers of the college act as mentor of the students who are advised about all the academic and college-related matters. Some departments organize students' seminars, workshops etc. The teachers make use of ICT, e-resources and Power Point Presentation for the effective teaching. The college has subscribed e-books and e-journals through INFLIBNET. The college has a total of 16 ICT enabled class rooms 1 smart class room 70 desktops & 7 laptops for academic purpose, and a strong Wi-Fi connection but it needs to be increased to strengthen the teacher's skills and to update them with ICT tools. Open-source software packages are used to teach different subjects but the college should also subscribe some paid softwares to increase the number of users.

#### Qualitative analysis of Criterion 3

The college has a Research Committee to motivate the faculties to apply for grants for research from several funding agencies like UGC, CSIR, DBT etc. so that they can carry on their research and publish their findings in research journals. The Research Committee encourages teachers to participate in workshops, conferences and training programs. During the assessment period one major research project was carried out, 32 research papers have been published by the faculty members in peer reviewed International and National journals listed in the UGC website. The faculty members have also published 53 books/book chapters in the current assessment period. The college management sponsored Research Project Scheme has been introduced recently. In current academic year college announced 4 (four) projects- one for science faculty, sanctioned amount Rs 15000/; 2 (two) for Arts faculty, sanctioned amount @ Rs. 10000/ each and one for Commerce faculty, sanctioned amount Rs 10000/. To sensitize the students about bio diversity, wild life management etc. excursions and field surveys were conducted by various departments. Various seminars and webinars were also conducted on different relevant issues including Intellectual Property Rights (IPR). The institute has organized some career counseling programs to assist the students to get jobs. A number of extension and outreach programs were conducted by the NCC & NSS volunteers, various academic departments, Students' Forum etc. The NCC & NSS units sensitize the learners on various issues related to bio-diversity, environmental sustainability and national aspects. The College through its NSS have made contribution in the neighboring area, and environment by carrying out various extension activities. These include conducting seminars, awareness camps etc. They also organize social awareness programs on World AIDS Day, Antitobacco Day and International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking. The college campus is completely tobacco free. The NSS units and NCC unit organized Blood Donation Camp and health check-up camp separately at college premises as well as in adopted villages.

Infrastructure of the college is limited. Most of the Science departments have inadequate classrooms, and laboratories. Few departments have facilities of photocopy and scanning. The college office is equipped with internet facilities and facilities of xerox and scanning. A medicinal plant garden and a rain water harvesting plant are maintained by the college. The central library of the college is equipped with INFLIBNET. The Library has a collection of around 31,666 books and 1174 reference books. Library also has possession of some important old manuscripts. It also has reading room and facilities for online searches for books. There is the facility of departmental libraries in most of the departments. It has also Ranadhir Bandyopadhyay Smriti Gyano Tattho Kendra for job seekers.

In the college campus total 50 classrooms are available. The separate common rooms for boys and girls are provided by the college. The common rooms are equipped with basic amenities like pure drinking water, toilets, Newspapers and indoor games. The common room for teaching staff has also similar facilities.

For the science stream 07 laboratories are available. The departments of Science subjects have limited chemicals, biological specimens, herbariums and instruments. For uninterrupted power supply, there are two DG generators in the college premises. There are fire extinguishers and sufficient water supply facility in all the laboratories of science departments. The department of zoology and Botany both are enriched with collection of specimens.

For the accommodation of out station students there is a boys' hostel with a very limited capacity. The college has a big playground, firing range, volley ball court and a gymnasium.

There are some IT facilities in the college. A budget is prepared annually to maintain the existing facilities, to continue the ongoing project smoothly and to organize new activities on the basis of priority.

The institution maintains student mentoring and support mechanism. In the beginning of every academic year the updated version of the college prospectus is published. Two official websites of this college www.sonamukhicollegebankura.com and www.sonamukhicollege.ac.in also provide the information needed by the stake holders.

The college has several student welfare schemes which include financial help by providing half-free and full-free of tuition fees, scholarships, endowments, etc.

The college canteen sells food to the students at reasonable rates. To solve various academic and personal problems of the students, the faculty members of every department engage themselves to mentor the students at the department level.

The institution has a Placement Cell to groom the students for their future endeavors. The departments also motivate many students to prepare for the different competitive examinations.

The Grievance Redressal cell tries to redress the grievance of the students at the earliest. The anti-raging cell, committee for prevention of sexual harassment and disciplinary committee are formed to address and resolve their complaints. For the quality improvement of the college the feedback mechanism is effectively used.

There is a democratically elected students' union/council to maintain a liaison between the students and the teachers and to organize a number of sports and cultural activities. The magazine "Pragati" use to be published by the students' union and there is also the custom of publishing wall magazine to show the literally and creative skill of the students in different departments and library.

The memorable days like Rabindra Jayanti, Birthday of Vivekananda, Teachers' Day etc. are celebrated by the students. The college has alumni association but it is not registered yet.

The Principal works as the Secretary of the Governing body. The Governing Body formulates policies to govern the college. All the major decisions on finance, development, management etc., are taken by the governing body considering the suggestions and recommendations of IQAC and different sub-committees of the college. The College adheres to Bankura University Statute and is governed by Regulations of Department of Higher Education, West Bengal. The College adherers to the reservation policy of state Government for recruitment of teaching and non-teaching staff. Several Sub-Committees are formed to ensure decentralized and participative management to look after the curricular as well as co-curricular aspects.

The teaching staff, non-teaching staff and the students of the institution work together to promote core institutional values, sense of responsibility and overall awareness. In the current assessment period, the college has taken measures to preserve flora of its surroundings. The college has been maintaining a medicinal plant garden. These plants are totally nourished by the students of botany department and NSS volunteers. During the pandemic situation the faculty members of every department have carried on online classes. The biometric attendance for teaching and non-teaching staff has been implemented for the smooth running of the college. Green audit for the last three academic session has been carried out.

For environmental conservation several steps have been taken by the college. Some of those steps are using LED bulbs, using solar powered lights, harvesting of rain water, planting useful trees, gardening etc.

The college takes proper measures for the Safety and Security of women. The whole college campus is under the surveillance of CCTV to prohibit any types of nuisances.

There is a day care centre for female staff and students.

The college has compost pit for solid waste management. College has set a Vermi composting unit and mushroom cultivation unit under the supervision of Department of Botany.

Academic council, Teachers' council, and Students' union/council are involved in planning, development, administration, finance, accounts, students' admission and examination.

For the welfare of teaching and non-teaching staff, there are the provisions for PF, CL, EL, ML, Maternity Leave, Childcare Leave, Vacation Leave, Co-operative society for giving loan to teachers, provision of payment of a part of salary as an advance to newly appointed teachers, and ex-gratia for casual staff etc. The institution has a registered Co-operative Society. For casual non-teaching staff the college provide welfare schemes like NPS, medical insurance, PPF etc.

The faculty members are granted leave for attending seminars, workshops, FIPs, RCs, OPs to enhance their professional skill. There is performance-based appraisal mechanism for the faculty members of the institution.

IAQC is functional. It plays a significant role to guide and review the activities of the institution to develop and monitor the annual action plan for teaching, research & departmental activities and to analyze feedbacks from different stakeholders.

The external audit of the college is conducted by an Audit Farm assigned by Hon'ble DPI, Government of West Bengal, whereas the Academic and Administrative audits are conducted by the guidelines set by the affiliating university i.e. Bankura University.

The College has received Rs. 70 lakhs from state government for the extension and up-gradation of Library building.

- · Introduction of CCTV cameras in the whole campus for better governance and management.
- · Fruitful mentoring system and effective students support mechanism.
- · Garden of medicinal plants inside the campus.
- · Location near the natural forests provides eco-friendly atmosphere in the campus.
- · Separate common room for boys and girls.
- Central library of the college is equipped with INFLIBNET and NLIST digital database.
- · Provision of personality development of the students through sports and cultural activities.
- · Facilities of big play ground, volley ball court, firing range and gymnasium.
- · Provision of three NSS units and one NCC unit both for male and female.

#### Weaknesses:

- Most of the students of this college are first-generation learners and belong to under privileged class.
- As the vast majority of the students belong to economically weaker sections of the society, there is a
  great tendency of a number of learners in low paying jobs and this increases the number of drop outs.
- As most of the students reside in the remote rural areas of Bankura district, they are not sufficiently
  acquainted with the internet technologies and lack of proper internet facility acts as an obstacle of
  their progress.
- Infra-structure of the college copes the present situation with some difficulties. Laboratories and classrooms of science department has a limited space.
- · Library is not having any advanced software.

- To improve the infrastructure of the college by making provision of one ICT enriched classroom for each department for better academic atmosphere.
- · To improve the condition of laboratories of lab-based departments.
- To create some substantive teaching posts and some non-teaching posts.
- To mobilize general funds for the improvement of the developmental activities of the college.

To increase the number of skill based training activities.
