## -----HISTORY

Some noble souls assembled in 1965-66 to give a shape of Sonamukhi College under the leadership of Prof. Anantalal Patra. Late Bishnupada Dey and Late Shaktipada Dey unconditionally donated 5 acres land for the college. A large number of people blessed supports including financial for its establishment irrespective of caste, creed, financial condition. The collective effort of the people is the result of a holy place of higher education i.e. Sonamukhi College.

## **Extension of infrastructure and domain of student benefit in the last Academic Year (2024-25)**

1. The construction work on the first floor of the B.C. Roy Administrative Building has been completed. A new seminar room, named as '*Vidyasagar Hall*' has started functioning there.
2. The construction work on the second floor of the B.C. Roy Administrative building is almost in the verge of completion.
3. Construction work on the third floor of Saktipada De Bhavan has commenced to expand classroom facilities and accommodate the growing academic needs of students.
4. A 2kVA solar panel system has been installed on the roof of the Science Building to enhance energy efficiency and ensure an uninterrupted power supply across the science building.
5. Additional equipment has been purchased to enhance laboratory facilities in the lab-based departments, supporting improved practical learning and research opportunities for students.
6. In the Academic Year 2024–25, the college has established new Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) with Sri Rashbehari Ghosh Mahavidyalaya, Barjora College, The Joy Guru Fish Farm, Trijal Excelled Foundation, and WBREDA. These agreements aim to enhance the teaching-learning environment through initiatives such as faculty and student exchanges, jointly organized seminars, conferences, workshops, and collaborative research. Additionally, the partnerships focus on improving and maintaining the college's infrastructure for the benefit of the students. 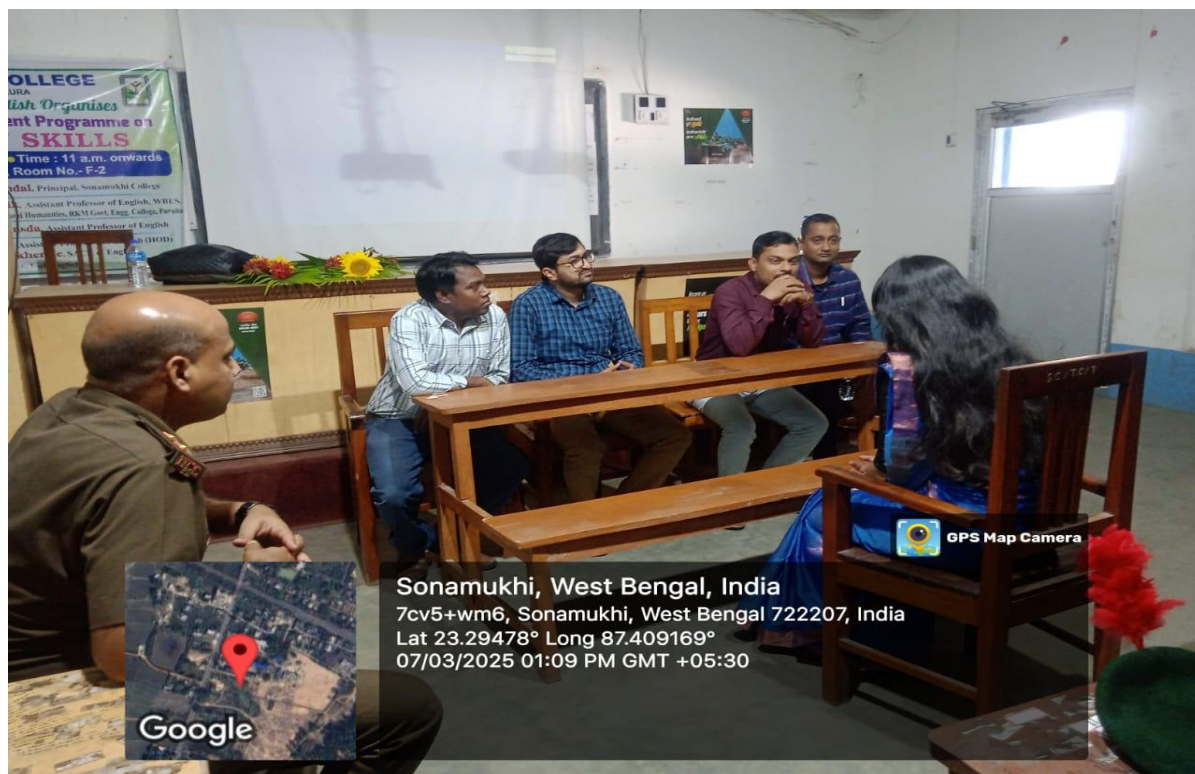

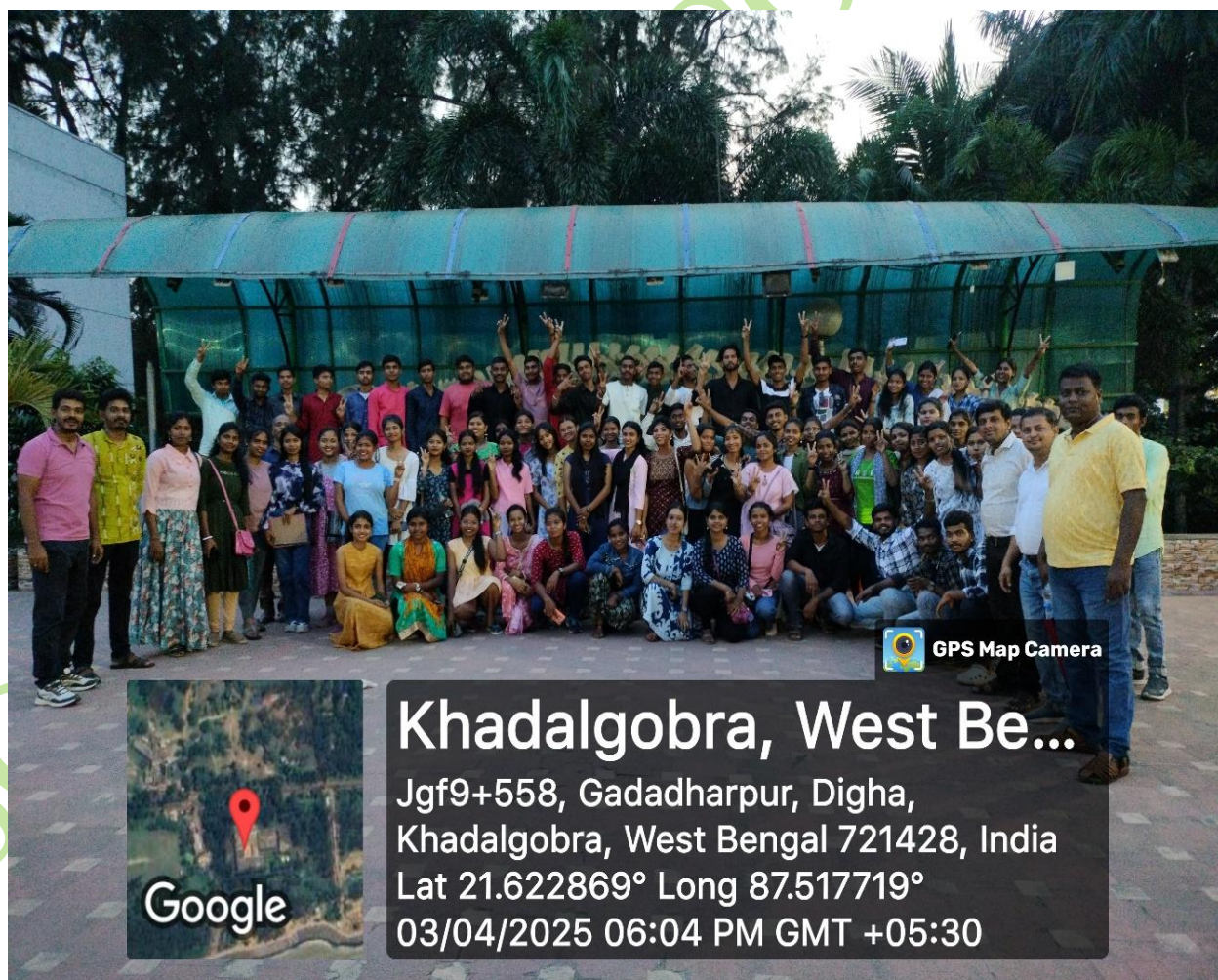

### **Maintenance of safe and secure environment for students in the College premises**

Sonamukhi College is always thoughtful regarding the maintenance of safe and secure environment for students in the College premises. For this, committees like Internal Complaints Committee regarding sexual harassment (Vishakha Cell) for girl students and Anti-ragging and Grievance redressal cell for all the students of the college are taking active part each and every day. Along with these, the measures taken are as follows-

- 1) Psychological counsellor for students is available in the situation where students need guidance and mental support. The students can contact over email and phone the respective person as and when needed.
- 2) A total of 8.11 acre area of the campus is supported by green energy. In playground also there is 2000 W security lights.
- 3) The campus has 94 cameras with CCTV surveillance for the safety of staffs and students in general.
- 4) Girls' hostel facility is ready for girl students in a safe and secure environment.
- 5) To make the campus "Divyangjan" friendly, there is the presence of ramp facility in the Bishnupada De Block, Science Building and ladies' common room. Ladies common room is also equipped with hand rest at proper places.
- 6) There is scope for financial support that may be provided to girl students who will rank 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> in the end semester exam among the students of our college and are intending to take admission for Master's degree in a govt aided university.

## Various Student Support System in the College

**Scholarship:** According to the eligibility and suitability of the students, they can apply for various governmental scholarship schemes like SVMCM, Aikyashree, Kanyashree, OASIS, Nabanna Scholarship, etc. They can apply also in various non-governmental scholarships like Jindal, and others. The college helps and guides so that one can get their applicable scholarship.

**Student Credit Card Scheme:** The students can apply for the Student Credit Card of WB Govt. as per rules of the scheme. The college organizes awareness camps to motivate students in applying the same.



**West Bengal Govt. Free-Ship Scheme:** The eligible students of Sonamukhi College get a Full-fee waiver and Half-fee waiver on the tuition fees according to the rules and guidelines of the scheme.

**Students' Aid fund:** Also, the poor and needy students get financial assistance from the college fund under the Students' Aid fund scheme.

**Samadhan Aid Fund:** Besides the various scholarships provided by the State Govt. and other organizations, Staff Council has formed 'Samadhan Aid Fund' to support the economically weaker students. Great initiative from all staff of the college supports extreme needy students. It is planned for provision of benefit to approximately 200 students from all departments during academic session. Priority is given to students having AAY card and Samajik Suraksha card. The convener, based on recommendation from each department, will select the students from each department for award of aid. Departmental recommendation will be made on the basis of following criteria-

(a) Attendance in class (b) Annual income of the parents (c) AAY card (d) Samajik women Suraksha Card.

**Contribution from Teachers' Council:** The Teachers' Council of Sonamukhi College contributes yearly to the development of the college as well as to helping needy students in various forms.

**Awards declared for Special achievement by students:** To motivate the students to achieve success in the curricular and various cocurricular activities, the Sonamukhi College authority has declared various awards for the students of the college. These are given in the following.

- 1st, 2nd & 3rd rank holder of Bankura University in each subject of UG Level of the college students (subject to the information of ranks from Bankura University & if the candidate is available) are honoured with Rs.10,000/-, Rs.7,000/- and Rs.5,000/- respectively.
- Honour money of Rs 20,000/-: For each participant in the Republic Day Parade at New Delhi from the cadets of NCC unit or Volunteer(s) of NSS units.
- Honour money of Rs 10,000/-: For each participant in the Republic Day Parade at Kolkata from the cadets of NCC unit or Volunteer(s) of NSS units.
- Honour Money of Rs.5,000/-: For the best cadet and best volunteer of each unit of NCC & NSS of the College each year.



- Honour money in cultural, sports, athletics, drawing, etc. events:
- ❑ National Level (organized by Govt. of India only): Rs. 20,000/- for 1<sup>st</sup>rank, Rs.15,000/-for2<sup>nd</sup>rank, and Rs10,000/- for 3<sup>rd</sup>rank.
- ❑ State Level (organized by Govt. of WB only): Rs.10,000/-for 1<sup>st</sup>rank, Rs.7,000/-for2<sup>nd</sup>rankandRs 5,000/-for 3<sup>rd</sup> rank.
- Financial support provided to the girl students (Initiative from Vishakha Sub-Committee) who rank 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> in the end semester exam among the students of our college and are intended to take admission for Master's degree in a govt aided university.

### **Note:**

1. Student who opts to exit after completion of the first year will be awarded a **UG certificate** provided he/she has to earn minimum required qualification as per affiliating Bankura University.

2. Student who opts to exit after completion of the first year, will be awarded a **UG Diploma** provided he/she has to earn minimum required qualification as per affiliating Bankura University.

3. Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded **UG Degree in the Major discipline** after successful completion of three years and satisfying the minimum credit requirement notified by the affiliating Bankura University.

4. A four-year **UG Honours degree in the major discipline** will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme and satisfy the minimum credit requirement set by the affiliating Bankura University. Students who wish to undertake research work at the 4<sup>th</sup> year will be awarded **UG Degree (Honours with Research) in the concerned major subject** after earning the required minimum credits set by the affiliating Bankura University.

5. A detailed course structure is given at the end of this prospectus. All the courses will run strictly following the curriculum, course structure, syllabus modules, assessment modalities and others rules and regulations prescribed by the Bankura University time to time. **N.B. - Every student will have to take admission in 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> semester separately.**

**ADMISSION PROCEDURE:** Admission to various courses in 1<sup>st</sup> Semester of 3-Year or 4-Year UG Degree Programmes in Sonamukhi College will be conducted through the Centralized Online Admission Portal run by The Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal. During registration, the students have to opt for the courses available in Sonamukhi College to get admitted to the Sonamukhi College. During registration process, the students will be able to check the eligible courses from Sonamukhi College for their own. All the rules and regulations prescribed by the Higher Education Department, West Bengal, Bankura University and Admission Sub-Committee of Sonamukhi College will be strictly followed during the entire admission process.

**Registration for Application:** Online registration is mandatory for entering the admission procedure. Application for more than one course can be made using one single registration. Students who have passed H.S. or Equivalent Examination in 2023, 2024 and 2025 may apply for admission through the online registration. The link for registration is <https://wbcap.in>. It is also available in the home page of the college website <https://sonamukhicollege.ac.in>

**Permanent and Own mobile number and email id** of applicants are mandatory to fill up online application form for password confirmation as well as for future correspondences with Sonamukhi College and Bankura University (if got admitted).

During application candidates shall have to upload the scanned images of their Admit card and Marksheet of MP or equivalent Exam, Registration of H.S. or equivalent Exam, Marksheet of H.S. or equivalent Exam, Caste Certificate (if applicable) and PWD Certificate (if applicable).

Finally submitted online application will be activated AUTOMATICALLY for merit list generation.

An applicant may **apply for maximum 25 (Twenty five) Major courses** irrespective of faculty (science/Arts/Commerce) from a single registration.

During Registration, students have to arrange their selected courses according to their preference level. This is very important. If a student intends to take admission in Sonamukhi College, he/she has to arrange the courses of Sonamukhi College eligible to him/her in higher preference level. There will be options in the online portal for this arrangement.

During applying, the students are advised to carefully organize the opted courses according to their preference level. Note that, if any student gets selected in more than one course at any stage, he/she will be allowed to take admission only to the course with the highest preference level. Besides, after getting a chance to a particular course, whatever the preference number is, the candidate shall have to take admission for that particular course by completing the payment procedure. However, they will be able to activate the 'Upgrade' option to move to a higher preference level labelled course, if become selected in any future merit lists. But if a candidate does not accept the chance for his first time, he/she will not be considered for any future merit lists. Again, note that, through the upgrade process, the candidates will only be able to move to a higher preference labelled course, not to a lower labelled course.

**Choice of Physical Education & Sports will be final after fitness test by the Department.**

### **Common Information to Applicants:**

- viii. Always download soft copy of filled-in application form and payment receipts (if any). These will be auto generated. It is also advised to keep the hard copies of the said documents properly.
- ix. Candidates are advised to log in to their accounts and check their merit positions frequently in their own interest so that they do not miss any chances.

**Details of Merit List Generation:** Subject wise and category wise merit list(s) will be published on the online admission website on the stipulated date & time. The merit list will be auto-generated depending on the seat capacity of a particular course and based on the following ranking rule. An SMS and email will be sent to the applicant's mobile and email id. After being selected for any particular course, the candidate has to confirm it by making the payment in the online admission portal within the stipulated date and time. After getting a chance to a particular course with any preference number, if a candidate does not accept it in the online portal within the stipulated date and time, his/her chance will automatically be gone and he/she will not be considered further in the following merit lists for any course. College authority will not be responsible for non-delivering of messages/emails in electronic mode for any reason. So, candidates are advised to log in to their accounts and check their merit positions frequently in their own interest so that they do not miss any chances.

#### **Rules for preparing Merit List:**

Merit lists will be prepared based on the total marks of best five subjects obtained in Higher Secondary or Equivalent Examination (First language will be counted twice if only four subjects are offered by any recognized Board/Council in H.S. or equivalent examination).

**Tie-Breaking Rule:** If the merit score of two or more number of applicants become same for any particular course during preparing the merit list, the total percentage of marks obtained in the Class X level exam will be considered for ranking. However, if this score also becomes same, the date of births of the candidates will be considered for ranking.

**Cancellation of Admission:** Cancellation of admission and refund of admission fees (if any) will be made as per the rules sets in wbcap.in and according to the decisions of Sonamukhi College Admission Committee.

However, during Admission Procedure, applicants have to select only the Major Subject and Minor Subject in the online admission portal. If a student cannot select a particular Minor subject in the portal during subject selection, it means the intake capacity for that particular subject has already been fulfilled.
