It should be remembered that many successful leaders, and socially conscious and vigilant citizens are being developed from here

An IKS (Indian Knowledge System) cell has been formed in our college to be aware of different Indian cultures, Indian heritage, etc. among the students. It is mentioned that an International seminar will be arranged in our college in the academic session 2024-25. Sanskrit is taught very seriously in Sonamukhi College and special classes are also taken on chanting as Sanskrit is known to be a heritage of the Indian Cultural legacy. In this college, teaching is done mainly in regional languages. Here Bengali is the mother tongue of the majority of the students, but a significant number of students know the Santali language as their mother tongue is Santali. The NSS, Economics, and Social Work departments in the college regularly undertake survey and community development programs in the Santali-dominated villages.

A Learning Outcome-based Curriculum aims to bring about uniformity in the syllabus for all programs in all the affiliated colleges of Bankura University. A variety of approaches to teaching Learning processes like lectures, seminars, tutorials/workshops/practical and project-based learning fieldwork, technology-enabled learning internships, and apprenticeship and research work is suggested. The student learning outcome should be defined in terms of knowledge skills understanding values employability. 1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

The curriculum is designed by the affiliated university, i.e., Bankura University. The organisation uses a meticulously thought-out and recorded procedure to guarantee the delivery of the curriculum. Before the commencement of each academic year, meetings are held with all faculty members under the auspices of the Academic Subcommittee to devise specific plans for efficient curriculum delivery. The college's academic calendar is developed per Bankura University's academic calendar. Accordingly, a master routine incorporating all the departments is prepared following a unique lesson plan by a teacher.

The college's respective department arranges departmental meetings, regular classes, examinations, internal evaluations, and student monitoring during the semester. Additionally, the department is responsible for implementing schedules as directed by the college administration. Students are assigned to departmental instructors to establish personalised profiles through individualised mentorship. Furthermore, the department collects feedback and conducts periodic

assessments of the students. To cater to the student's needs, the college utilises social media platforms such as official Facebook pages and WhatsApp groups as instructional tools to engage with the students.

The College has well established Central Library. Some departments have their Departmental Library. The students have effectively utilized the library services available to them.

Every faculty uses a combination of conventional chalk-and-talk methods and ICT-enabled teaching-learning methods to deliver the curriculum. Students are urged to enrol themselves for career-focused certificate programmes and different Add-on Courses, such as Sanskrit Chanting and Computer Courses etc.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The college's academic session commences with an Orientation Programme for newly enrolled students. Furthermore Parents-teachers meet is also done at the beginning of the academic session. This programme aims to enlighten students about the academic, professional, and extra/co-curricular prospects available at the college. At the onset of each class, students are presented with the syllabus for their respective subjects.

The faculty at Sonamukhi College is tasked with identifying advanced and slow learners during the initial stage of student admission each academic year. This was achieved through 'diagnostic tests' conducted at the beginning of the academic year, as well as by reviewing students' home assignments. As a result, each department had adopted a distinct approach to address these two scenarios. In the case of slow learners remedial coaching, counselling was arranged. On the other hand, the students who scored comparatively high in the university-level examinations were considered advanced learners and special monitoring and awards was arranged for them. For further promotion of the students, various seminars on important and relevant topics was organized. Every student was provided with value-adding classes and learning materials- both in hard and soft copies, PPT presentations etc. as and when required.

Furthermore, for both types of students, parent-teacher meetings, mentor-mentee relationships, and other timely communication, such as regular class tests, assessments, and assignments, were provided.

Sonamukhi College underscores that students are the main stakeholders of the college. Consequently, all academic initiatives within the college are designed with a focus on student-centric principles. For the this academic year the College faculties emphasized on the teaching-learning process such as,

How much they consider the students' prior knowledge, about the curriculum and pedagogy, talk about the objectives, and new contents, take their feedback and deputize the subject, and engage the students in the assignments. As a result, the students become aware of their future learning, thereby increasing their performance.

As a form of experiential learning, the college aims to provide students with concrete experiences resulting in enhanced reflective observation. In addition, student excursions, educational tours, and their reports were taken to teach students about abstracting, conceptualization and the main objective is to enable active experimentation of the students.

In the participatory method, for the session 2023-2024 the college gave more importance to student seminars and the Mutual Learning Method. Advanced learners often present their views in front of the students and teachers and thus the questionnaire session continues. Village-based socio-economic and political surveys are conducted during educational trips and discussions are held in face-to-face meetings.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

For the conduct of the internal examination, all the DICs of the college in consultation with the academic sub-committees, set question papers for the internal test exam for students and set question papers for submitting the internal assignment for them.

Sonamukhi College, being affiliated with Bankura University, adheres to the university syllabus, examination, and evaluation system. Internal assessment carries a weightage of ten marks. To ensure transparency, the college had conducted assignment, viva voce, projects, diagnostic tests, and class tests as part of the continuous improvement process, allowing students to identify and learn from their mistakes. Maintaining a minimum of seventy-five percent attendance is mandatory for all students and it was seriously maintained for the each academic session. The institution has constituted Academic and Examination Committees to facilitate a smooth and conducive academic environment. The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) has been in operation in this college from the 2017-18

academic session and NEP has been implemented for the academic session 23-24 onwards.

The primary objective of assessment is to comprehensively identify the strengths and weaknesses of the students. At our college, continuous assessment was conducted in a structured manner throughout the semester to facilitate effective evaluation and progress of the students. Opportunities for guidance and support was provided to students to enhance their learning. Additionally, specific assignment schedules were provided to students across all courses. Faculty members internally evaluated the students and allocated scores out of 10 for each paper.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

Internal assessment plays a crucial role in the evaluation of the teaching-learning process. Students were provided with timely information about the question format, examination dates, and the entire internal and end-semester examination system. At the commencement of each semester, they received a comprehensive guidance on the internal and external examination procedures during an orientation or introductory session.

Affiliating Bankura University (BKU) the college conducted an external examination, termed as End Semester Examination (ESE) of 40 marks (each paper), and the provided marks for Internal Assessment (IA) of 10 marks (each paper). The ratio of the weightage of marks for external examination is 80% and for internal examination 20%.

Throughout the session, the mentors remained always in touch with the mentees regarding internal assessment and tried to resolve any complaints immediately. Being in rural areas, many candidates sometimes could not able to upload their internal assessment scripts on time. INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college campus spans 8.11 acres and is outfitted with comprehensive security measures, including CCTV cameras, to ensure the safety of all students, staff, and visitors. It is designed with state-of-the-art facilities and learning resources to support and enhance academic performance per the college's vision of achieving academic excellence. The infrastructure facilities and learning resources available are further detailed below -

1. The educational facility consists of a total of 49 classrooms and 6 laboratories and 17 ICT classroom.
2. The college provides computer access with internet connectivity

in all departments. It has an extensive central library with an impressive collection of over 30,000 textbooks, approximately 1,174 , 6 different magazines, 3 scholarly journals, and various newspapers. Additionally, our library is equipped with facilities to access and search the National Digital Library of India (NDL) and the Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) resources

3. The college has constructed a new boys' hostel in addition to the existing running boys' hostel. Furthermore, a college girls' hostel has also been built, but it has not been opened yet (present condition see) This accommodation is especially beneficial for students who find it challenging to commute daily.

4. The institution has taken measures to ensure accessibility for individuals with disabilities by installing a ramp at the entrance of the college building and library.

(Vishakha Cell) to aware the girl-students about their legal rights and privileges. The college provides two common rooms, one for the Boys and another one for Girls. The common rooms have been designed to give students a place to study, for personal discussions and to relax. For emergency and urgency one napkin-vending machine has been installed inside the Girls' Common Room. There is a day care centre for our female staff and students, where they can arrange to keep their baby with their nearer good female attendant. During 2023-24 International women's day has been celebrated through a gathering with the students as well as a hands-on training programme was organized to strengthen the local self-help group women with the techniques of herbal abir preparation.

Solid Waste: In college there are different colour dustbins for different types of waste. Biodegradable waste products originate from college canteen generally, and these are stored in small pit for composting. After certain period, waste products are converted

into compost and later it is used as compost fertilizer in plant garden. Nondegradable solid wastes are generated through routine activities. It includes paper, plastics, glass, metals and packaging materials etc. These wastes are collected and segregated with greatest care at each level and source. Solid wastes are segregated to gather it in separate dustbins based on the recyclability and biodegradability. The institution discourages plastic use in the campus for its betterment

E-waste: All the departments use electronic components for teaching and office & library are going through the digitalization process, so generation of electronic waste is a normal phenomenon. Outdated/damaged and non-repairable electronic articles are treated as e-wastes which include computers, printers, routers, mouse, UPS, CCTV cameras, photocopiers etc. These are stored in separate room.

Liquid Waste: Sewage, Toilet and Canteen generate liquid waste. Liquid waste is generated during food preparation from the Canteen and from the laboratories and washrooms which is safely disposed of through internal sewage system connected to the Sonamukhi Municipality sewage line.

The college's academic session commences with an Orientation Programme for newly enrolled students. Furthermore Parents-teachers meet is also done at the beginning of the academic session. This programme aims to enlighten students about the academic, professional, and extra/co-curricular prospects available at the college. At the onset of each class, students are presented with the syllabus for their respective subjects.

The faculty at Sonamukhi College is tasked with identifying advanced and slow learners during the initial stage of student admission each academic year. This was achieved through 'diagnostic tests' conducted at the beginning of the academic year, as well as by reviewing students' home assignments. As a result, each department had adopted a distinct approach to address these two scenarios. In the case of slow learners remedial coaching, counselling was arranged. On the other hand, the students who scored comparatively high in the university-level examinations were considered advanced learners and special monitoring and awards was arranged for them. For further promotion of the students, various seminars on important and relevant topics was organized. Every student was provided with value-adding classes and learning materials- both in hard and soft copies, PPT presentations etc. as and when required.

Furthermore, for both types of students, parent-teacher meetings, mentor-mentee relationships, and other timely communication, such as regular class tests, assessments, and assignments, were provided.

For the conduct of the internal examination, all the DICs of the college in consultation with the academic sub-committees, set question papers for the internal test exam for students and set question papers for submitting the internal assignment for them.

Sonamukhi College, being affiliated with Bankura University, adheres to the university syllabus, examination, and evaluation system. Internal assessment carries a weightage of ten marks. To ensure transparency, the college had conducted assignment, viva voce, projects, diagnostic tests, and class tests as part of the continuous improvement process, allowing students to identify and learn from their mistakes. Maintaining a minimum of seventy-five percent attendance is mandatory for all students and it was seriously maintained for the each academic session. The institution has constituted Academic and Examination Committees to facilitate a smooth and conducive academic environment. The

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) has been in operation in this college from the 2017-18 academic session and NEP has been implemented for the academic session 23-24 onwards.

The primary objective of assessment is to comprehensively identify the strengths and weaknesses of the students. At our college, continuous assessment was conducted in a structured manner throughout the semester to facilitate effective evaluation and progress of the students. Opportunities for guidance and support was provided to students to enhance their learning. Additionally, specific assignment schedules were provided to students across all courses. Faculty members internally evaluated the students and allocated scores out of 10 for each paper.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

Internal assessment plays a crucial role in the evaluation of the teaching-learning process. Students were provided with timely information about the question format, examination dates, and the entire internal and end-semester examination system. At the commencement of each semester, they received a comprehensive guidance on the internal and external examination procedures during an orientation or introductory session.

Affiliating Bankura University (BKU) the college conducted an external examination, termed as End Semester Examination (ESE) of 40 marks (each paper), and the provided marks for Internal Assessment (IA) of 10 marks (each paper). The ratio of the weightage of marks for external examination is 80% and for internal examination 20%.

Throughout the session, the mentors remained always in touch with the mentees regarding internal assessment and tried to resolve any complaints immediately. Being in rural areas, many candidates sometimes could not able to upload their internal assessment scripts on time. The college authorities granted them with extra time subject to negotiation for reasonable reasons. There are routine examination committees for the timely and proper conduct

of internal examinations, that issued timely notices. If students had any complaints regarding the mode of examination, marks etc they were allowed to redress their grievances to the grievance redressal cell.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college campus spans 8.11 acres and is outfitted with comprehensive security measures, including CCTV cameras, to ensure the safety of all students, staff, and visitors. It is designed with state-of-the-art facilities and learning resources to support and enhance academic performance per the college's vision of achieving academic excellence. The infrastructure facilities and learning resources available are further detailed below -

1. The educational facility consists of a total of 49 classrooms and 6 laboratories and 17 ICT classroom.

2. The college provides computer access with internet connectivity in all departments. It has an extensive central library with an impressive collection of over 30,000 textbooks, approximately 1,174 , 6 different magazines, 3 scholarly journals, and various newspapers. Additionally, our library is equipped with facilities to access and search the National Digital Library of India (NDL) and the Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) resources

3. The college has constructed a new boys' hostel in addition to the existing running boys' hostel. Furthermore, a college girls' hostel has also been built, but it has not been opened yet (present condition see) This accommodation is especially beneficial for students who find it challenging to commute daily.

4. The institution has taken measures to ensure accessibility for individuals with disabilities by installing a ramp at the entrance of the college building and library.

- In case of vacancy against the post of Assistant Professor, the college sends a requisition to the West Bengal College Service Commission. The recommendation of the Commission is placed in the Governing Body and after its approval appointment letter is issued.
- The State Government appoints State Aided College Teachers (SACT), based on the selection process done by the College.

Non-Teaching Staff:

The whole college campus is under the surveillance of CCTV to prohibit any types of nuisances. The college authority issues identity cards to all the students and staff of this college for integrity and security. There are separate wash rooms for the girls and female staffs. Although an Anti-ragging cell is prevailing in the campus, however, no such incidence of ragging happened. There is an internal complaints committee (Vishakha Cell) to aware the girl-students about their legal rights and privileges. The college provides two common rooms, one for the Boys and another one for Girls. The common rooms have been designed to give students a place to study, for personal discussions and to relax. For emergency and urgency one napkin-vending machine has been installed inside the Girls' Common Room. There is a day care

centre for our female staff and students, where they can arrange to keep their baby with their nearer good female attendant. During 2023-24 International women's day has been celebrated through a gathering with the students as well as a hands-on training programme was organized to strengthen the local self-help group women with the techniques of herbal abir preparation.

Solid Waste: In college there are different colour dustbins for different types of waste. Biodegradable waste products originate from college canteen generally, and these are stored in small pit for composting. After certain period, waste products are converted into compost and later it is used as compost fertilizer in plant garden. Nondegradable solid wastes are generated through routine activities. It includes paper, plastics, glass, metals and packaging materials etc. These wastes are collected and segregated with greatest care at each level and source. Solid wastes are segregated to gather it in separate dustbins based on

the recyclability and biodegradability. The institution discourages plastic use in the campus for its betterment

E-waste: All the departments use electronic components for teaching and office & library are going through the digitalization process, so generation of electronic waste is a normal phenomenon. Outdated/damaged and non-repairable electronic articles are treated as e-wastes which include computers, printers, routers, mouse, UPS, CCTV cameras, photocopiers etc. These are stored in separate room.

Liquid Waste: Sewage, Toilet and Canteen generate liquid waste. Liquid waste is generated during food preparation from the Canteen and from the laboratories and washrooms which is safely disposed of through internal sewage system connected to the Sonamukhi Municipality sewage line.
